Boat stickers are required before boats go in the water. If you operate a boat without a sticker, you will be subject to a \$25 fine. To get a boat sticker, first **PRINT OUT** a Boat Registration Form located on our website at <u>www.littleswanlake.net</u>.



- 1. COMPLETE THE BOAT FORM.
- 2. MAKE A COPY OF YOUR ILLINOIS BOAT REGISTRATION (REQUIRED FOR ALL MOTORIZED BOATS).
- 3. ENCLOSE A CHECK FOR THE BOAT FEES.
- 4. SEND TO THE LITTLE SWAN LAKE CLUB, PO BOX 341, AVON, IL 61415

Many boat registration forms that been received but do not have a copy of the current IL State Board Registration Card attached. Very often the reason given is because the boat is still in storage and the State Board card is in the boat. The suggestion is: Whenever you get a new State registration card, make 3 or 4 copies of it before you put the original in your boat and keep the copies in your house. That way you will always have a copy handy to send in to us every year. Another problem people have is that they have applied to the State for a renewal but have not yet received their new card. We realize the State sometimes can take a long time to send out your new card. In that case, you can just send a copy of the receipt you received from the State showing that you have applied for a renewal.



NO-WAKE ZONE – Watch Out for the Buoys! SLOW DOWN!

Please be careful when boating. The no-wake buoys are in place for a reason – they warn boaters to lower their boat speed so there is no wake behind their boat when traveling past the marker buoys. It's very SHALLOW at that end of the lake. PLUS, lots of waves from boats will erode the shoreline over time.

NO-WAKE ZONE - Swimming Safety

The following lake rules apply when swimming off your boat in the no-wake zone past the nowake buoys. These rules will be strictly enforced with a minimum fine of \$25 for the first offense. Repeated offenses could lead to the loss of your lake privileges.

- 1. YOUR BOAT MUST BE ANCHORED WITH THE MOTOR TURNED OFF.
- 2. BOATS MUST ANCHOR IN THE CENTER OF THE NO WAKE ZONE, NOT IN THE TRAFFIC LANES
- 3. HOURS: SWIMMING IS ALLOWED FROM 30 MINUTES BEFORE SUNRISE UNTIL 30 MINUTES AFTER SUNSET
- 4. SWIMMERS MUST STAY WITHIN 30 FT. OF THEIR BOAT.
- 5. A RESPONSIBLE PERSON, 18 YEARS OR OLDER, MUST STAY IN OR BE TETHERED TO THE BOAT.
- 6. NO DIVING ALLOWED

Building Permit Reminder

LSL has rules concerning any new or improved construction on your property. Be aware. Any building project such as a house, boathouse or storage shed, dock, boat lift, deck, garage, home addition, etc. requires a permit and approval by the LSL Building Committee. Building forms can be downloaded from our website at <u>www.littleswanlake.net</u>.

Storage Sheds - The storage shed rules have been updated to accommodate a larger size shed. The new changes are: a storage shed can now be a maximum of 196 square feet with wall sides not to exceed 8 feet and the peak not to exceed 11 feet. If the lot owner wishes a larger shed, the structure will need to follow the permanent garage rules which include a foundation.

Solar Panel Guidelines

While there is no fee for the installation of solar panels on any property, the same process of applying for a building permit is required before installation can begin. Only flush mounted roof panels are to be used and the panels must match the existing roofing material. Ground mounted panels systems area prohibited from use.

Please read and obey all size and creel limits. Current boat sticker and fishing license are required.

Bass	10"-15"	6 per day
Bass	Over 15"	1 per day
Catfish	None	6 per day
Bluegill/Sunfish	Under 8"	25 per day
Bluegill/Sunfish	8" and over	5 per day
Crappie	Under 10"	No limit
Crappie	10" and over	5 per day
Walleye	15" or larger	3 per day
Northern Pike/Muskie	Catch and Release	
Any Carp or Green sunfish (rock bass) caught, please dispose of them.		
*Please do not put them back in the lake.
